The moderators will provide members of the seminar with a more comprehensive list of presentation topic ideas and suggested readings and other resources. The following is an abbreviated version of those lists.

Presentation Topic Ideas

- Prelude to the New Deal (1929-1932): key events (from Black Thursday through the 1932 election and the transition) and conditions leading up to FDR's first inauguration
- FDR's "Brains Trust:" members and their contributions
- The First Hundred Days: 99 executive orders/emergency declarations (e.g., the bank holiday), 77 laws and 15 programs (e.g., CCC, AAA, the Banking Act of 1933) passed by Congress and initial Fireside Chats
- Legislation/programs enacted between July 1933 and the 1936 election, including the Securities Act of 1934, the National Labor Relations Act, the Social Security Act and the Robinson-Patman Act
- Programs of the Works Progress Administration (WPA), including the Federal Art Project, the Federal Writers' Project and the Federal Theater Project
- Key Cabinet members and advisors, such as John Nance Garner, Frances Perkins, Henry Wallace, James Farley, Harold Ickes, Louis Howe, Harry Hopkins, Felix Frankfurter, and the "Black Cabinet"
- Prominent opponents of the New Deal, including the American Liberty League, Father Charles Coughlin, Huey Long (reserved by a co-moderator), Dr. Francis Townsend, Elizabeth Dilling
- New Deal era elections: 1934 midterms, 1936 presidential, 1938 midterms and 1940 presidential
- Supreme Court decisions and the "court-packing" plan (reserved by a co-moderator) 1937-1939: Civil Aeronautics Act, Fair Labor Standards Act, various reorganization acts and the "Roosevelt Recession"
